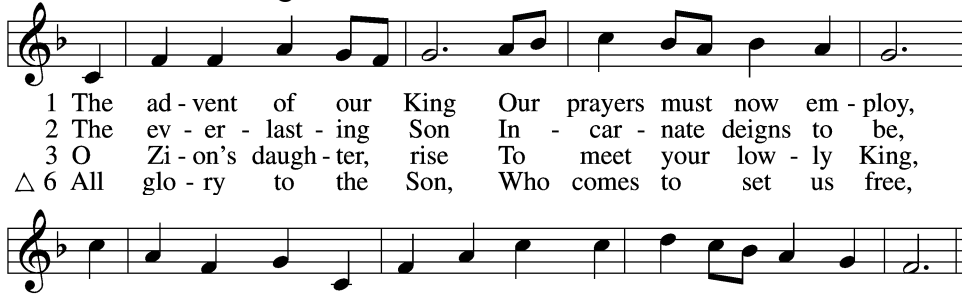

Genesis 3:1–13


