Order of Service

For to us a child is born, to us a son is given ... and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Isaiah 9:6

Invocation and Lighting of the Advent Candle

P In the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C Amen.

(Two purple candles are lit on the Advent wreath.)

P Today we light the second candle on the Advent wreath, the candle of peace. We may be

afraid at times, because we live in a world filled with violence. We may become caught up in personal struggles and family quarrels. We need the peace that only Jesus can bring.

C Lord, grant us your peace.

P The prophet Isaiah foretold the coming of the promised Messiah, the child who would be called the Prince of Peace. He would rule over all things, and there would be no end to his kingdom of peace.

C Lord, grant us your peace.

P Jesus was born to bring us peace, the peace that comes through the forgiveness of our sins, peace that the world can never give, peace that Jesus alone brings.

C Lord, grant us your peace.

Confession and Absolution

- P Let us confess our sins to God and ask him to have mercy on us.
- C Almighty God, even though you grant us your peace, we often destroy that peace by causing strife. We quarrel with others and condemn them. We pursue our own selfish interests instead of showing love to others. We turn away from the guidance of your holy Word. Have mercy on us, forgive our sins and grant us your peace.
- P God sent his Son, the Prince of Peace, to be our Savior. Jesus shed his precious, innocent blood, suffering the penalty of death that we deserved for our sins. I announce to you that your sins are forgiven in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

C Jesus, Prince of Peace, rule in our hearts with the peace that you alone can bring.
